
It has come to our attention that the Florida Department of Corrections may be in possession of units of our product, midazolam hydrochloride, and that the state is considering its use for capital punishment.

As we have previously communicated both to the Governor's office and the Department of Corrections (letters dated October 18, 2013), Hospira manufactures our products because they improve or save lives, and Hospira does not support the use of any of our drugs for capital punishment. Such use is clearly outside of the labeled indications for any of our products.

We therefore ask you to return any Hospira product that you may be considering for such unapproved use to Hospira immediately.
